In July, Downtown Burlington will be busy with activity during A Very Vintage Market, featuring more than 130 unique vendors and live music throughout the day. The historic Capitol Theater will host the Jazz Festival, offering two days of free, live performances featuring national and local talent. And don't miss the Fourth of July Celebration in Downtown West Burlington and the Mediapolis Celebration of 150 Years! These events are expected to draw many first-time visitors – who are sure to be impressed by the vibrancy, creativity, and charm of Greater Burlington.

The Downtown Farmers Market runs every Thursday through September – an easy way to support local growers, shop small, and enjoy live music. Summer fun also stretches beyond downtown, with attractions like Huck's Harbor Waterpark, FunCity, West Burlington Public Swimming Pool, and outdoor adventures at Big Hollow Recreation Area. We are so fortunate to have options for everyone!

2024 - 2025 Leadership Class

In September of 2024, the Greater Burlington Leadership Class began with their first assignment—identifying key community initiatives. After months of deliberation, presenting proposals to a jury, and cohesive teamwork, the class committed to enhancing community pride and visitor experiences in both Burlington and West Burlington.

Aligned with Downtown Burlington's recent designation as a Cultural & Entertainment District by the Iowa Department of Cultural Affairs, the Leadership class chose to make an impact using banners designed to bring color, history, and identity to the heart of the community.

The project spanned nine months, during which class members formed committees to handle fundraising, banner design, and marketing. The fundraising committee successfully organized Smash for a Cause, a pickleball tournament held at the Burlington YMCA in April. The event, which attracted over 50 players, raised over \$10,000 through sponsorships and registrations — marking a substantial achievement.

On May 6, banners were officially installed throughout Downtown Burlington, bringing the project to life. The banners highlight a variety of local icons and themes meant to capture the spirit of the district. Among them

are tributes to Burlington-born celebrities such as Aldo Leopold, Kurt Warner, and Bart Howard, along with banners that promote downtown events like the Jefferson Street Farmers Market.

Throughout the summer, visitors will see banners featuring vibrant stained-glass patterns — paying homage to the many historic churches in the area. As the year progresses, seasonal banners will rotate in, featuring designs with falling leaves, holiday lights, and winter snowflakes. While some banners encourage visitors to “Eat, Drink, Shop Local” and showcase Downtown Burlington as a hub for history, theater, coffee, dining, and more.

In addition, the class partnered with local school districts to host a 4th grade art contest. Students were invited to illustrate their favorite season, a favorite memory, or something they love about the Greater Burlington area. Of the 24 winning entries selected, 16 will be featured on banners displayed in Downtown Burlington. The student artwork brings a colorful, personal touch to the project and highlights the creativity and pride of the next generation.

Stay tuned for our July newsletter, where we'll share details on the West Burlington banner installation and their unique seasonal design plan.

Celebrate Independence Day at the 2025 West Burlington Fourth of July Celebration

Locals know: Celebrating our national holiday means gathering with friends in Downtown West Burlington on July 4 for family-friendly fun, live entertainment, and memories to last a year. Starting with the Fire Department Pancake Breakfast at 6 AM and lasting until the last twinkle of fireworks disappears from the night sky, the West Burlington 4th of July Celebration is a full day of festivities.

Live Music on the Deery Brothers

Outdoor Stage — In addition to a slate of events and games starting at 6 AM, live music will flood the West Burlington Downtown. Kicking off at 11:30 AM is a performance by local favorite Ruby Orr, followed by the country-rock sounds of Wildfire at 5 PM. Headlining the evening at 8:30 PM is The Breakfast Club, delivering an electrifying tribute to 1980s rock and dance hits that will have the crowd dancing in their Day-Glo boogie shoes.

All About the Bullfrogs — A spectacle not to be missed: The annual tradition (and local favorite) Broadway Bullfrog Race gets underway at 7 PM. Bullfrogs can be purchased at The Broadway Bar & Grill from June 1 to July 3. Remaining bullfrogs will be sold at 7 PM before the race.

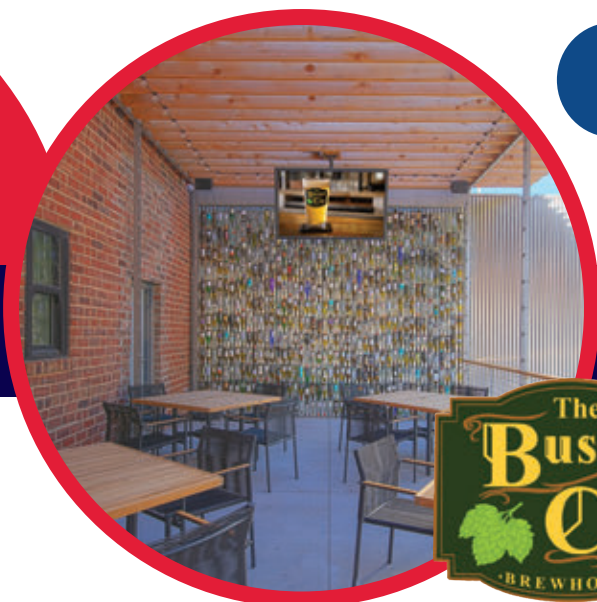

GREATER BURLINGTON LEADERSHIP CLASS OF 2024 - 2025 GRADUATES PROGRAM

On May 14, the Burlington/West Burlington Area Chamber of Commerce celebrated the graduation of the 2024-2025 Greater Burlington Leadership class at Barn on the Ridge Event Center. This marks another successful year of cultivating strong, informed, and connected leaders in the region.

Greater Burlington Leadership is a nine-month program designed to enhance leadership capabilities through targeted professional development and hands-on experiences. Whether participants are seasoned leaders or emerging professionals, the program offers valuable insight into civic responsibility and community engagement. Participants explore topics such as communication styles, interpersonal skills, project management, and leadership development. Each session provides behind-the-scenes access to key organizations and institutions that shape the Greater Burlington community.

Since its inception in 2012, 215 individuals have graduated from the program. More than just a series of sessions, Greater Burlington Leadership is a collaborative effort made possible by a dedicated volunteer planning committee, supportive employers, engaged community partners, and generous sponsors.

Session topics this year included: Arts & Culture, Economic Development, Education, Environment, Government, Healthcare, Diversity & Inclusion, Public Safety, and Workforce.

MAIN STREET IOWA CHALLENGE GRANTS: NOW OPEN FOR DOWNTOWN BURLINGTON PROJECTS

Downtown Partners, Inc. is excited to share that Main Street Iowa Challenge Grants are now available for eligible brick-and-mortar building rehabilitation projects within Burlington's designated Main Street district. These grants offer up to \$100,000 and applications are due by July 1, 2025.

Challenge Grants are a highly competitive funding opportunity through Main Street Iowa and are designed to support impactful projects that contribute to the economic vitality and historic preservation of downtown communities.

Competitive applications typically include:

- Meaningful building rehab projects that add or expand businesses, housing, or job opportunities
- Projects that showcase quality design and align with preservation-based strategies
- Redevelopment efforts that support local revitalization plans and attract additional investment
- Clearly defined, well-planned scopes of work that can be completed within the two-year grant period

Eligible project types include:

- Façade improvements (front, rear, and side of building)
- First-floor commercial and upper-story interior rehabilitation
- Structural upgrades and building systems improvements
- A specific, focused phase of a larger project (future phase commitment must be demonstrated)
- Impactful work on contiguous properties with a common need and shared ownership

Downtown Partners encourages interested property owners, developers, and entrepreneurs to consider this unique funding opportunity to bring impactful change to Downtown Burlington. Whether you're looking to improve your storefront, add upper-story housing, or address critical building needs, this grant could help turn your vision into reality.
