Collins currently serves Des Moines County in the Iowa House of Representatives and brings experience in both legislative and economic development roles. He previously served as a Policy Advisor to Governor Kim Reynolds and later as Senior Advisor to former Lieutenant Governor Adam Gregg. In these roles, he worked on rural development policy and pandemic response initiatives, among others.

He holds a Bachelor's Degree in Business Management from Iowa State University and dual Master's Degrees in Public Administration and Business Administration from Drake University.

As Executive Director, Collins will lead economic development strategies designed to grow the region's economy, attract investment, and create good-paying jobs. This is a results-driven, nonpartisan position—guided by the values of the Greater Burlington Partnership and overseen by the President & CEO and the Economic Development Board of Directors.

"We understand that new leadership brings questions as well as opportunities," said Amy O'Brien, President & CEO. "Taylor's role within the Partnership is entirely focused on delivering outcomes that benefit the entire community. He will be held to the same high standards as all staff and supported by the oversight and values that guide our organization."

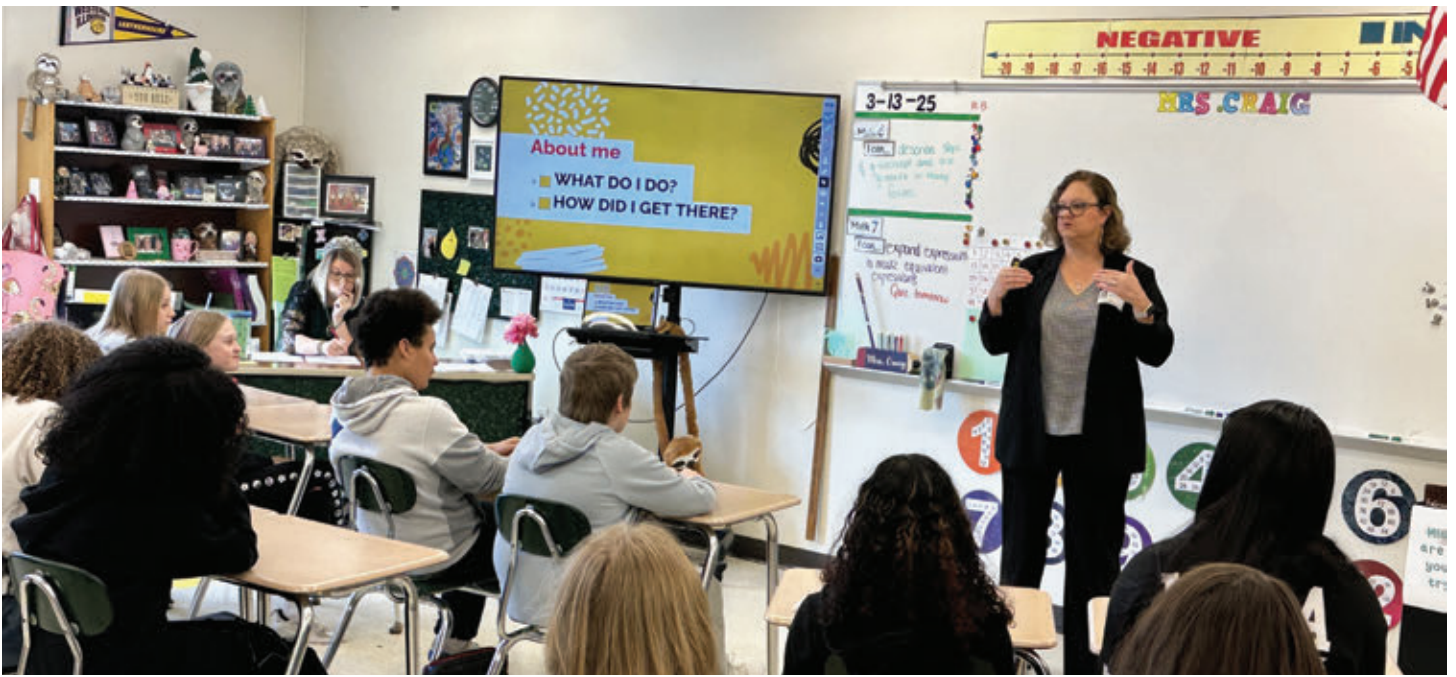

COMMUNITY LEADERS IN THE CLASSROOM UPDATE

The Greater Burlington Partnership recently wrapped up its spring round of the Community Leaders in the Classroom program, formerly known as CEO in the Classroom. This initiative connects local business leaders with 8th-grade students across Des Moines County to explore financial literacy, budgeting, and career opportunities available in the Greater Burlington area.

This year, the program reached approximately 600 students across all five school districts in Des Moines County – Burlington, West Burlington, Danville, Mediapolis, and Notre Dame. Through engaging presentations and interactive discussions, students gained real-world insights from professionals working in the community.

Five local leaders volunteered their time as speakers, including Amy O'Brien, President & CEO of the Greater Burlington Partnership, Aaron Engberg, Director of Business Development at Carl A. Nelson & Company, Tim Lundgren of Farm Bureau Financial Services, and Jeff Burkhart, Retail Banking Leader at Two Rivers Bank & Trust.

The program not only supports career readiness but also strengthens the connection between education and local workforce development.

LEADERSHIP 2.0 – RECAP

The April 15 Leadership 2.0 session focused on Creative Problem Solving, equipping participants with tools to approach challenges with innovation and confidence. The session explored how creativity isn't limited to artistic expression—it's a vital skill for leaders in any field.

Participants learned practical strategies such as design thinking, lateral thinking, and brainstorming techniques to spark fresh ideas and uncover new solutions. Through interactive discussions and scenario-based activities, they applied these tools to real-world problems, collaborating with peers to generate creative, effective outcomes.

This session emphasized that creative problem solving is not about always having the right answer—it's about asking the right questions, being open to new perspectives, and staying flexible in the face of complexity. Attendees walked away inspired to approach obstacles with curiosity and a can-do mindset, ready to lead with innovation in their organizations.





LEADERSHIP CLASS EXPLORES THE ENVIRONMENT

The Greater Burlington Leadership Class dove into all things “environmental” during their April 16 session, which featured a full day of learning, exploration, and hands-on experiences.

The day kicked off at Des Moines County Regional Waste/Area Recyclers with Darven Kendell sharing insights into local solid waste management and recycling efforts. From there, the group traveled to the Greater Burlington Partnership for city updates from Eric Tysland, followed with an opportunity to reflect with class compliments and graduation planning.

A highlight of the day was the engaging session, “What Does ‘Environmental’ Really Mean?”, presented by Jessica Coca, Environmental Department Manager at Klingner & Associates, P.C. *(Special thanks to Klingner & Associates for not only sponsoring the session, but also sharing their expertise in a meaningful and impactful way.)*

The afternoon featured a tour of Big Hollow led by Chris Lee from Des Moines County Conservation, followed by a visit to Wildlife Lakes Elk Farm with host Henry Bohlen. The class ended the day with a thoughtful debrief at Swan Lake Lodge before returning to the Partnership. Property owners in Downtown Burlington have an exciting opportunity to secure funding for building improvement projects through the Main Street Iowa Challenge Grant. This competitive grant offers up to \$100,000 for eligible projects, helping to revitalize and preserve historic buildings while strengthening the district. Projects within the Downtown district may qualify, including building rehabilitations, facade improvements, new construction, or adaptive reuse. Applications will be evaluated on preservation standards, architectural significance, and community impact.

Grant awards range from \$25,000 to \$100,000, requiring a 1:1 cash match. Federal or state grants cannot be used to fulfill the matching requirement.
